You have identified some leverage points that could be good places to intervene in the global food system. Now it's time to come up with some ideas (innovations) for how to impact that leverage point! In your groups, brainstorm 10 innovations or more based on one or more of your leverage points. Get creative and brainstorm freely in this phase. Pick 2 or 3 innovations that you develop more in-depth. Prepare a 5-minute Powerpoint presentation on these selected innovations, to be given in class on February 8th. When developing your selected innovations, consider the following:

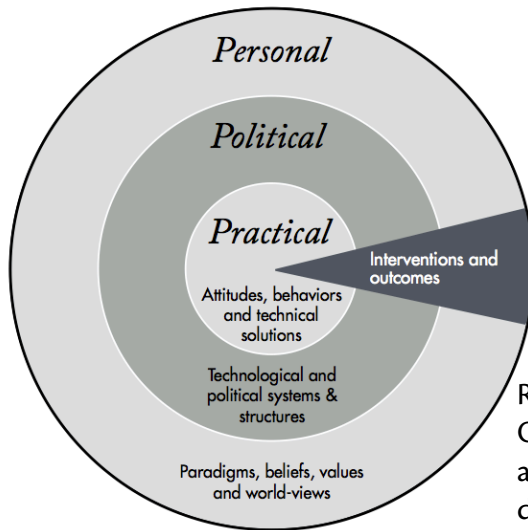
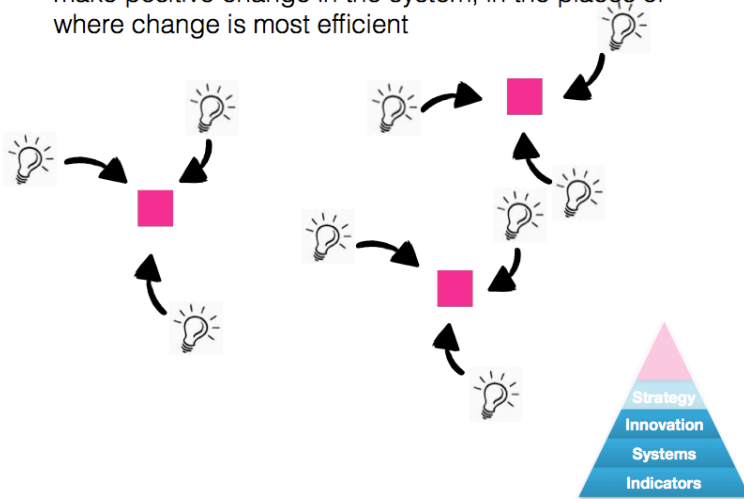
- In what way does the innovation lead to change in the system?

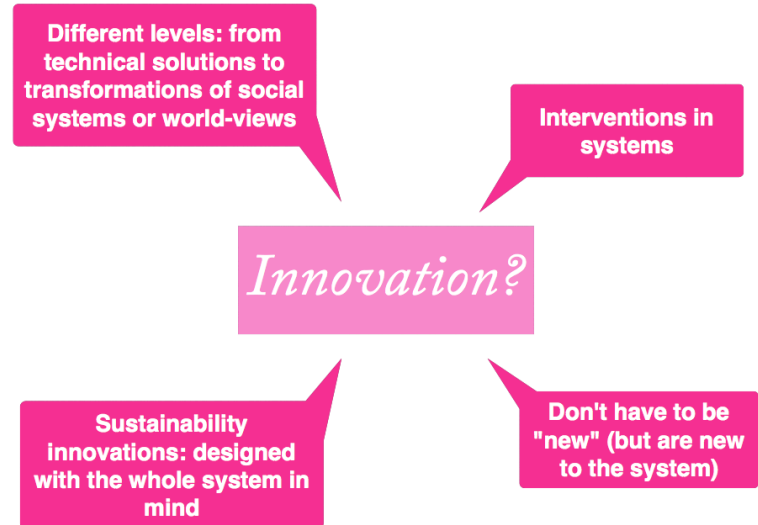
