

Make-up task for November 7 Whose vision is it?

What happened during the workshop?

On November 7th, we had a workshop that included:

- 1) an activity to reflect on privilege
- 2) presentation and introduction about Part 2 of the assignment Back to the FutureS We Want
- 3) role play to get insight into living in the society of 2067, from a different perspective

In this assignment, we want you to focus on part 3. In the workshop, students were asked to choose one of their four visions that they would rework in Part 2 of the assignment. Then, each received a 'role' - a short description of a person that is to be living in the vision that the pair has developed. The activity was then to interview how it was to live in the future that you have developed.

Your assignment

If you could not attend the seminar, you need to submit this make-up task by latest **November 27th at 17:00 (5pm)** on Studentportalen to fulfill the requirement to pass the course. Please also use this Make Up Task as a step to rework your visions, which you are asked to submit by latest November 20th (see assignment instructions for Part 2 - Visions Reloaded at: http://www.web.cemus.se/wp-content/uploads/2017/06/B2Fww_Instructions2_2017.pdf). Please also look at the [Course Reader for November 7th](#) and the [slides from Workshop 2](#) to better understand the concept of privilege and why we are asking you to do this activity. This whole Make-Up Task should be **400-500 words**. Include the following two tasks in your assignment:

1. **FEEL INTO YOUR ROLE:** We ask you first choose one vision out of the four visions that you have developed (again, see Assignment Instructions for Part 2). It could be a vision that you find especially interesting, one that you find unique, one that you think is most realistic or one that you feel most attached to.

Then, please write a short monologue from the perspective of one of these three roles living in your future vision: a) Soldier doing compulsory military service, female, 18; b) Pensioner living in an institution for elderly people, female, 83; c) Illegal immigrant, male, 39.

Here are some questions that you could write about:

- What does your everyday life look like? What house do you live in? How do you go to school/work? How does education/work look like? What do you do during your free time?
- What are you really happy about living in this region? What would you brag about to other places? How do you think life is compared to 50 years ago (2017)?
- What do you struggle with, or unhappy about?

2. **REFLECTION:** Did you get any new insights about your visions from this process? Share your reflections from this process. Feel free to also talk to others about the vision you developed to get insights and inspirations.
