






ENVIRONMENT, DEVELOPMENT & GLOBALISATION









Dear Student,

Warmly welcome to 'The Global Economy - Environment, Development and Globalisation'!

During the course we will focus on a number of socio-economic issues ranging from international trade, economic growth and climate change, to development, inequalities and finance. Throughout the semester, different theories and historical examples are analysed and discussed in sessions with knowledgeable and inspiring guest lecturers, in order to offer a multidisciplinary understanding of the global economy's role in today's world. Embarking on this journey of discovery, international and Swedish students will be asked to reflect critically on the past and current state of the global economy in order to imagine alternative economic futures.

Some of the complex questions we will be dealing with are: What is the real wealth of nations? How is the global economic system performing under increasing ecological and social pressures? Which institutions and actors have the best opportunities to work towards building desirable and sustainable economies?

Registration and Roll Call

- International and Swedish students who applied through antagning se need to register for the course online on studentportalen.uu.se by **Monday, August 20**th, the latest, otherwise you will lose your spot in the course.
- International and exchange students who have not applied through antagning.se will be
 registered at the mandatory course introduction. It is essential that you show up in person in
 order to keep your spot.
- If you are on the reserve list and want to take the course you need to show up to the course introduction as well, so we can sign you up in case there are any free spots.

The registration will take place at the first session of the course, on **Monday, September 3**, at 17.15 in the 'Humanistiska teatern' in the building 'Engelska parken' (entrance 3C opposite Carolina Redviva, see map). **You must attend the roll call** in person and remain active throughout the course, otherwise you will permanently lose your place. If you absolutely cannot make it, you can send another person in your place to register for you (but you must inform us this prior to the evening).

We usually have more applicants than we can accept for this course, so if you do not plan to register for the course please let us know as soon as possible at gec@cemus.uu.se so that we can accept someone from the waiting list.

Course Structure

The course is worth 15 credits (ECTS) and is thus given at 50% of a full-time study workload, which equals around 20 hours per week. Class is two nights per week, Monday and Wednesday evenings for the entire autumn semester. Lectures will take place in Hörsal 1 or 2 at Ekonomikum, whilst seminars will take place at Kollaboratoriet (see map and check the attached course schedule). However, the schedule and locations are subject to change so please check the course website frequently. Our offices are located at CEMUS headquarters at Geocentrum. However, as we only work park time it is best to email us rather than drop-in.

Expect a considerable workload for this course. The backbone of the course schedule is the lecture series, with guest lecturers from universities, government agencies and organisations from civil society. Lectures are complemented by seminars, workshops, a debate, and other activities in which we will discuss and analyse course literature and subjects brought up in lectures. More information on course content, assignments and assessment, will be available in the 'The Global Economy Course Information Booklet' for 2018, which you will receive shortly before the beginning of the course.








Map of relevant buildings
