The Assignment

Part 1: Sustainable Development

Re-read the original 1987 Brundtland Commission definition of Sustainable Development. Compare this with **three** other definitions of Sustainable Development. How have these definitions of sustainable development evolved over time? In your response critically compare the strengths and limitations of these definitions.



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Part 2: Defining a Project

What are the key criteria for a project that works towards a sustainable development? Refer to relevant course literature and sources of your own choosing.

Part 3:

This coursebook **The Handbook of Sustainability Literacy** presents a number of topics and skills associated with sustainability challenges and possibilities. Pick one chapter that you are interested in. Read this chapter thoroughly, so that you are familiar with the key points.

Once you've read this chapter, find and read at least two other texts that offer alternative perspectives to the chapter you read.

How could you apply these perspectives to a potential project this semester?

References

Refer to relevant course literature throughout your assignment, as well as academic articles, lectures, videos, course books or other appropriate material. Make sure to make it very clear to the reader when you express your own ideas and opinions, and when you refer to sources and other people's opinions or research.

Be sure to

- Use either footnotes, i.e. the **Oxford system** or include the references in the text, i.e. the **Harvard System**
- Include a reference list at the end of the document
- Be consistent with your referencing
